She endured numerous setbacks in obtaining housing, transportation, and employment. Renee has excelled at her job and won several promotions. Through the counsel of CCCS, Renee organized her bills on her own and worked hard to clear up her debts on her own. Over the past year, Renee has been able to do more with her money than simply pay her rent and bills on time . . . she is pursuing ambitious educational goals and providing for her girls the extras that every girl deserves, and that she was not able to provide in the past – things like dance lessons, soccer, cheerleading and even a trip to Dutch Wonderland!

Renee has successfully moved from homelessness to self-sufficiency. She has shown initiative in creating goals for herself and reaching those goals.
